--petencies, diagnose leadership strengths and gaps and develop leadership talent to strengthen performance and produce results.

"We work with school administrators around the country," said Mike Evans, president of Chorus, Inc., which is the parent company of the Hallmarks program. "They go through an assessment, then a series of training and development. The leadership development training helps school administrators to be the most effective leaders they can be to maximize student learning."

"I've always believed in improving and setting goals and getting better," Stegall said. "This program has helped me understand my weaknesses as a leader and look at them from a different perspective. What I thought were my weaknesses might not have actually been my weaknesses. I also learned how to use my strengths to improve my weak areas."

Stegall said the program not only helped her in her professional life, but her personal life as well.

"I know I'm a better leader now and am more effective with teachers and students," she said. "The changes I've seen in myself through this is that I'm more willing to face confrontation and face situations that are difficult. Instead of sending an email when something is wrong, I am able to confront issues in a way that's respectful for them but in a way that I still get my point across."

"Every time we had a session, I came back the next day and applied something to my school and my personal life. My goal is to take what I learned and share with the teachers. I want to model how I want my teachers to treat the students in their classrooms."

--that action at this week's special meeting.

The outlets are utilized every year by Texas Steak Cookoff participants, so officials felt it would be a good idea to have the outlets installed. But with the City Hall renovation project getting close to finished, council members are looking closely at money to make sure they hit the budgeted \$690,000.

"The people that really, really need power at the Steak Cookoff generally tell us beforehand, and we can set those people up close to downtown so they can plug in to the poles down there," said City Administrator Lambert Little. "It really just boiled down to the money -- council members are looking very closely at everything right now."

Also discussed was an apparent discrepancy in billing for drywall and installation brought up at a previous meeting by Councilman Mike James. The discrepancy is expected to result in a refund to the city of about \$3,000.

Council members also viewed carpet samples, and discussed the new brick work on the front of the building. There has been some discussion as to whether the new front brick wall should be torn down and replaced because it "balloons" out in the center. Council members decided to take more time to think about what should be done before taking any action on the matter.
